Take the Way of the Gospel: Moving with the global Church into a reimagined future

Earlier this year, at gatherings of clergy and lay leaders from parishes, Archbishop Peter A Comensoli proposed that we 'Take the Way of the Gospel' together, renewing the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne's focus on mission, and opening ourselves to Pope Francis' call for 'a missionary impulse capable of transforming everything'. The journey of Take the Way of the Gospel in 2021 has not been without uncertainty and restrictions due to COVID-19, and yet more than 1500 people from across our Archdiocese have begun planning, discussing and discerning together with their communities. Proposed Bill a 'serious overreach': Archbishop Comensoli

Archbishop Peter A Comensoli has written to all members of the Melbourne Catholic community expressing grave concerns about the State Government's proposed new legislation, the *Equal Opportunity (Religious Exceptions) Amendment Bill 2021.* In the letter, the Archbishop explains that the proposed changes will significantly impact all faith-based organisations in Victoria who will no longer be able to employ staff who hold the same religious beliefs and values unless they can prove that it is an 'inherent requirement' of the job. Parishes are encouraged to share this message widely with their parishioners.

Red Wednesday, 24 November: Stand up for persecuted Christians

Across the Archdiocese, we are invited to stand in solidarity on Red Wednesday, 24 November, and to pray for those around the world who are suffering violence, persecution and death simply for professing their religious beliefs. A range of resources—including five ways to mark Red Wednesday—have been developed to help parishes, households and individuals mark this day in a meaningful way. And St Patrick's Cathedral will join other cathedrals, churches and prominent buildings around Australia and the world on 24 November by floodlighting the exterior of the cathedral in red and by holding a prayer vigil at 7.30pm.

You will also be able to find regular news items on liturgy-related events and developments, and a more logical, attractive site design and more intuitive functionality will make it easier to navigate and to find what you need. That's just the beginning though—there are more exciting new features on their way next year.
