

# People of the light

Welcome to Proclaim, a regular newsletter to help keep parish leadership teams informed and inspired as they proclaim and live out the joy of the Gospel.

In his recent <u>Patrick Oration</u>, Archbishop Peter A Comensoli offered us a striking image of ourselves as the light-refracting people of God—each of us a unique shard of glass, together forming a great window through which the light of God might shine into our homes, families, communities and relationships, and from there out into a world wearied by pandemic, overshadowed by conflict, and riven by division and distrust.

Drawing on this inspiring vision for the domestic Church, and the foundational place of marriage and families within it, we explore how our homes and our mission might both be transformed through initiatives such as the <u>Marriage Kit Formation Program</u>. We also hear about how one Melbourne parish has been <u>engaging with its community in creative ways</u> through the seasons of Advent and Lent, and we offer some practical advice from Fr Dan Serratore MGL on how our mission can be reinvigorated by <u>a team-based approach to parish leadership</u>.

Archbishop Peter takes up the theme of the dawn light of the risen Jesus <u>in his Easter</u> <u>message</u>, and we announce two new initiatives to get involved in over the coming month. First, Archbishop Peter will be celebrating <u>two special Masses in May</u>, recognising the contribution of health- and aged-care workers throughout the pandemic, and remembering the lives that were lost during this challenging and socially isolated time. We also have some suggestions for how local parishes can celebrate their own Masses of thanksgiving within their communities. Second, the *Take the Way of the Gospel*Steering Committee is <u>seeking expressions of interest</u> from clergy and laity to become members of the Stakeholder Advisory and Reference Group.

Other events and resources featured in this bumper issue of *Proclaim* include the *Walking in the Spirit*Plenary Council prayer campaign, our new UDisciple website for students and young people, an online faith formation series being offered by Catholic Theological College in May, resources for Laudato si' Week, and advance notice to save the date for an RCIA training opportunity.

This Holy Week, as we travel from the dereliction of the cross and darkness of the tomb out into the Easter dawn, may we recommit ourselves to being people of God's light and hope—in our homes, our parishes, our communities and our world.

• Mass to commemorate those who have died during the COVID pandemic Sunday 22 May 2022, 11am

This Mass will be offered for all the departed who could not be mourned properly or whose lives could not be celebrated suitably because of pandemic restrictions.
